

The original Minutes of the Lilydale District Cricket Association Annual Meeting for season 1921-22 have not been found but there was a newspaper article in the Lilydale Express on Friday 22nd September 1922 provides some details.

"Lilydale District Cricket Association

The Annual Meeting of the above association was held on Monday evening at Wandin. The President, Mr. R. Morton, occupied the Chair. Delegates were present representing the following clubs – Wandin A and B teams, Lilydale, Woori Yallock, Silvan and Seville. The balance sheet showed the association to have a credit balance.

The medal donated by Mr. R. Morton for the best bowling average for the association was won by D. Keenan of the Woori Yallock club. The President presented the medal to Mr. Staff who received it on behalf of Mr. Keenan who was away in the country. The delegates thanked the President and Secretary for services rendered during the past season. The election of Office Bearers – President Mr. R. Morton unopposed, vice presidents Messrs. J. M. Mitchell and L. Mattingley, secretary and treasurer, Mr. Arthur Jones.

After discussion on rules it was decided to add a new rule to read- 'that a player to play in semi or finals matches in this association shall play in at least five matches as per fixtures'. The Secretary informed the delegates that he considered that the entry fee for the association could be reduced and it was decided to reduce same to one pound and one shilling. The trophy fee will remain the same – three pounds and three shillings (?). Mr. Morton again promised a trophy for the best bowling average for the association.

Discussing the country cricket week in Melbourne it was agreed that we send an eleven down this season. Only players who can stay the full time will be selected.

A keen competition should result this year as each club considers it has strengthened its team."
