

The original Minutes of the Lilydale District Cricket Association Annual Meeting for season 1936-37 have not been found but there was a newspaper article in the Healesville and Yarra Glen Guardian on Saturday 18th September 1937 that provides some details.

"Lilydale Cricket Association

With the exception of the Warburton club, from whom an apology was received, a full muster of delegates attended the annual meeting of the Lilydale District Cricket Association last Thursday, when President Mr. C. R. Goode of Mount Evelyn occupied the chair.

After a long discussion, in which a suggestion that teams be grouped and divided into two sections according to location was defeated. It was finally decided that the competition be conducted as it was last season, in A and B sections. With the withdrawal of Lilydale from the B grade, the A section will comprise nine clubs (as last year) and the B grade five teams.

Delegates expressed warm appreciation of Mr. W. Bowring's generosity in again presenting a handsome trophy for the most consistent player. In addition, the president again donated a pennant for the premier team in A grade. A trophy will be presented to each winner of the batting and bowling averages in both A and B grades.

Clubs are requested to note that any player desiring to transfer to another club must now include an endorsement from the secretary of his club before a permit will be granted.

The draw for the first round, to commence on October 2, is as follows – A Grade – Lilydale v Wandin, Mt. Evelyn v Warburton, Powelltown v Yarra Junction, Woori Yallock v Hoddle's Creek. Seville a bye. B grade – Gruyere v East Wandin, Cave Hill v Seville, Woori Yallock a bye. Matches will be played on grounds of first named clubs. "
