The lesson learnt from these matches is that team practice on turf is essential before entering into these games, and that a coach be appointed.

Captain of the R.D.C.A. team on this occasion was Ray Curnow (Heathmont). All who took part in this game considered it a good day and praised the hospitality of the hosts at the Albert Ground.

Our teams in all the above matches were not as strong as they might have been due to the fact that all Clubs did not nominate players for selection. All Clubs were advised by letter and notice of these games was given in the local Press. It is in my opinion, an honour to represent the Association in these games and I feel sure that, if all players knew of them, there would be more available for selection. In other instances, in the past, players have been nominated by their Clubs without first consulting the players re their availability, thereby causing considerable embarrassment to Selectors and players alike.
