Amendment of Rules.

Umpires.—It was decided to appoint professional umpires for A and B grade semi-final and final matches, and that the competing clubs in these stages defray the cost of same.

Semi-final and Final Matches.—Resolved that the old practice of semi-finals and final matches be adhered to.

Late Starting. — Resolved that teams not ready by 15 minutes after the appointed time for starting be fined 7/6, in addition to liability to be protested.

Country Week Cricket.—At the instance of Messrs. Clota and Hunt, it was determined 'not to affiliate this year with Country Week Association, in view of the great difficulty of players obtaining the leave necessary for the matches.

Meetings.—These are to be called as deemed necessary.

Opening of Season.—Resolved that the season be opened on September 28th, and that it be optional whether a pennant or trophy was presented to the winners of the premiership.
