#### SECRETARY'S REPORT 1985-'86 SEASON

I guess everyone is aware that the R.D.C.A. Inc. Junior Competition is a big affair but how many realise just how big it is? Certainly I didn't before but now, after a year as Secretary I surely do!

In season 85/86 nearly 200 teams participated in just short of one thousand games of cricket. And the fact that all of this happened without any major traumas is a tribute to everyone involved; from the Junior Executive, Club Junior Administrators Team Managers, interested parents and, most importantly, the juniors themselves. The point is the season just 'doesn't happen, its made to happen through the efforts and commitment of so many people.

In hindsight the most difficult thing about the 85/86 season was getting it under way: the draw had to be redone so many times because of late withdrawals and nominations of Teams. The easy way out would have been to leave byes where teams dropped out and to not accept late nominations. But this wouldn't have been in keeping with the spirit of the competition which is to make as much cricket as possible to as many juniors as possible. While this was achieved, it wasn't without considerable effort, the type of which is so often taken for granted. Hopefully the rule changes for team nominations for 1986/87 will improve this situation.

Its harder to pick a highlight because there were so many of them - the success of our representative teams, the keen competition in all grades through the season, the Presentation Night, etc. But I think the move to presentation of premiership pennants at the conclusion of each final, and the plaudits this brought from everyone, would rate high on the list.

Yes, I've enjoyed my year as Secretary. Its been a pleasure to work with the other members of the Executive in this capacity and the co-operation I've received from Junior Administrators especially has been first class. My wish for all of us is that season 86/87 will be, at least, as good.

#### JUNIOR REGISTRATION AND RECORDS SECRETARIES REPORT

The 1985/86 season once again saw this area shared, which has proven to be quite successful due to the good working relations between all members of the Junior Executive.

The beginning of the season was extremely hectic, with the team nominations of clubs being changed on numerous occasions, resulting in many hours of work by members of the Junior Executive to formulate new draws. New rules have been accepted which is hoped all alleviate this problem.

Another area which continues to be a problem each season is that of late lodgement and incorrectly presented Match Result sheets. Once again this leads to many extra hours work, plus the inability of the Association to present correct and uptodate ladders at the completion of each round.

During the season there was a total of 148 clearance applications lodged, the majority of these being handled efficiently by the clubs concerned. Unfortunately there will always be problems with unregistered or ineligible players, the result being fines or loss of points. In season 1985/86 there were 74 Unregistered players, 5 over-age players and 6 ineligible players. This resulted in 28 teams losing hard earned points, whilst the remainder resulted in fines for the clubs concerned.

Apart from the problems mentioned the Junior section of the R.D.C.A. has again proved to be one which provides an outstanding standard of cricket for the young people of our area.

The Association provided cricket for more than 3400 junior players in three age divisions. A total of 41 clubs fielded 149 competitive teams and 22 non-competitive teams.

Thanks go to the Junior Administrators of the clubs within the R.D.C.A., who in the main, assisted the Junior Executive to ensure that a good season was enjoyed by all.

#### R.D.C.A. REPRESENTATIVE CRICKET. SEASON 1985/86

Season 1985/86 saw many representative games being played in all age divisions against a number of associations.

The R.D.C.A. is extremely proud that so many boys were able to participate at the representative level.

The following gives an indication of the R.D.C.A. involvement.

#### UNDER 12

A total of 26 players filled the two teams that played against the Ferntree Gully District Cricket Association. These boys also played in the Inter. Assoc. Cricket Carnival.

#### UNDER 14

A total of 24 players played in the two teams fielded against the FTGDCA, these two teams also played in the Inter Association Cricket Carnival. Another 12 boys played for the Croydon C.C. in the Hatch Sub - District Competition. A combined team from the above three sides played against the Shepparton District Cricket Association.

#### UNDER 16

Some 20 boys played in matches against FTGDCA and the Goulburn Valley Cricket Association. Many of these boys also represented Ringwood C.C. in the Dowling Shield.

The strength of the R.D.C.A. was shown by the success of the representative teams at all levels.

The Under 12's were runners-up in the I.A.C.C.

The two Under 14 teams played off in the final of the I.A.C.C.

The Croydon Hatch team were the victors in their hard fought competition.

The Under 16's also had success in many of their matches.

Selection in these teams is a great honour, and the boys selected must be congratulated on the manner in which they represented the Association and their own clubs.

#### REPORT ON FINALS UMPIRES 1985/86

The appointment of umpires for the Finals was difficult, due to the poor response by a number of member clubs, in failing to nominate one umpire.

In addition seven umpires who assisted in the semi finals were unavailable for the Final.

Although umpire resources were stretched to the limit, two umpires were appointed to the majority of games. Thanks are extended to all of the Club Members who volunteered services.

The overall standard was very high, and complimented the eveness of the competition. Finally, as in past years we thank the Senior R.D.C.A. Umpires for their contribution. It is very much appreciated.
