REGISTRATION SECRETARY'S REPORT

Season 1976 saw us continuing our growth in number of senior and junior teams and players.

We fielded an additional 10 senior and 9 junior teams making a total of 120 senior and 91 junior teams for the season. There were 2391 seniors and 2025 juniors registered as players with the R.D.C.A. during 1976/77.

During the season 212 players sought either clearances or permits which was an increase of 27 over the previous year.

As usual the finances of R.D.C.A. were improved quite considerably by fines incurred for infringement of rules. This continues to be source of concern to the Executive as it imposes needless additional work upon the Club, R.D.C.A. Treasurer and myself as well as increasing the cost of playing cricket for the Clubs concerned. In an effort to improve this situation the Executive have asked that the rules be amended so that all clubs have a nominated Registration Secretary in the coming season.

I would like to thank all Clubs for their support and co-operation during the 1976/77 season and wish all clubs and players a successful 1977/78 season.

UMPIRE'S REPORT

A special "thank you" to all those who have volunteered to umpire the junior finals and thus make their game so much more enjoyable. In some cases the volunteers even umpired in the morning and played in finals themselves during the afternoon. Two of these came from the nearest Club in our Association, Bayswater Park, and one of them made 125 in his final, which seems to ridicule those who make excuses for not helping the kids out. I was particularly disappointed with a lot of the bigger clubs who couldn't or wouldn't or didn't even try to recruit umpires. We can't continue to reap benefits from the Association without putting something back.

The official umpire panel was depleted this year, but when 14 out of 30 leave, is it any wonder? Three left because of illness, 3 returned to playing cricket, 4 for work reasons, 2 to umpire where the pay is better and 2 for team misbehaviour. I remind you that more of us will find better or at least other reasons to occupy our Saturday afternoons if clubs don't control their players and spectators more.

Fortunately we recruited 3 experienced umpires and two new members who improved markedly with experience. Also Jack Hall came back after a long illness and we were pleased to find he umpired just as well as before. Two more experienced umpires have indicated they will join next year but how can we build the panel up to 40 or more? Should we make it mandatory for the bigger clubs to provide one official umpire for the year before being allowed to join the Association?

Our President, Harold Matthews, and I would like to thank the umpires that loyally stuck to us when the going was tough instead of leaving or accepting inducements in other areas.

The coming season should be more enjoyable for players and umpires with the installation of better pitches.

JUNIOR SELECTION REPORT

Nominations of players for the Australia Day Inters Association games were disappointing in both number and quality.

However, the selectors were eventually able to select truly representative teams in the Under 16 and Under 12 age groups and these teams quickly moulded into winning combinations.

The Under 14 side was selected after a series of practice matches and practice sessions but, despite intensive coaching by the Team Manager and other volunteers, the team was overwhelmed by a vastly superior side. However it was pleasing to see the fierce determination displayed by our team in the face of these huge odds and I am sure that every member tried his utmost for the R.D.C.A.

The Team Managers were not impressed with the arrangements made by the South Suburban Churches for our games at Central Park.

The wickets and approaches were in very poor condition and no matting was supplied for the Under 12 match.

S.S.C.C.A. Officials and Umpires were few in number and our Umpire had to officiate at both ends all day in the Under 12 game. The Team Managers for all games were appointed at the last minute and were unsure of their duties and responsibilities.

Because of the lack of enthusiasm by the S.S.C.C.A. it would seem that inter-Association games of this type are not held in high esteem by that Association and the R.D.C.A. Team Managers question whether inter-Association games against the S.S.C.C.A. should be continued.

Our Team Managers, Messrs Tim Strafford and Bill Neal deserve our thanks for their dedication and our umpires also merit special praise for their neat attire, calm efficiency and enthusiasm.
