UMPIRES COMMITTEE:

During the currency of the 1955/56 Season the Umpires in this Association formed the R.D.C.A. Umpires Committee. This Committee with Mr. R. Johnson as their President, and Mr. R. Evans as Secretary did a splendid job and by their discussions took a big step towards improving umpiring generally and thereby lifting the standard of cricket in the district. The R.D.C.A. owes quite a good deal to this Umpires Committee and it is hoped that the Committee will grow and function in 1956/57.

XMAS CARNIVAL GAMES:

The R.D.C.A. again entered a team in the "Under 23 Years" Xmas Carnival conducted by the V.J.C.U. The team acquitted itself excellently and reflected great credit to themselves and the Association, - they won 2 games and lost the third. The team was captained by Mr. B. Bond (Bedford) and was managed by Mr. A. Neil with Mr. W. Barkway as official scorer. To these gentlemen the Association records its thanks.

INTER-ASSOCIATION GAMES:

The Inter-Association Games with the FernTree Gully Cricket Association were resumed this year on Australia Day.
