UMPires' Committee

After successfully recruiting ten new Umpires before and during Season 1971-72, we looked forward to providing Umpires for the lower grades of the Association in Season 1972-73, but such was not the case. Ten Umpires left the Panel, three to Sub-District, one became a Player, one retired through illness, one took an Executive position in a Club and four left for business reasons. Five new men joined, resulting in a Panel of 22 members. We aimed to provide 44 Games with Umpires each week. Where did we fail? Advertisements in the local Press drew a blank, pleadings to Club Delegates proved to be unsuccessful, so I appeal to all who read this to convince their retiring Players to become Umpires next Season. We believe that the general standard of umpiring improved during the year and this was backed up by Captains' Reports, which were more consistently received than during previous Seasons.

One aspect that displeased us considerably was the number of reported Players which indicate that discipline is lax in the Clubs to which these Players belong. Please keep this in mind when making selection of Captains and Administration members next Season. The Umpire is appointed to make Cricket decisions, not to control unruly Players. His concentration will naturally suffer if incidents of a reportable nature are allowed to occur.

I thank the majority of Captains for their constructive and helpful Reports during the past Season and look forward to even more co-operation in Season 1973-74.

During the Season we held monthly Meetings which were well attended and where the Umpires' Advisor, Mr. Reg. JOHNSON advised of problems raised by Captains and other interested persons. One of the Meetings was attended by the Secretary of the Victorian Cricket Umpires' Council and two of his colleagues. We rejoined the V.C.U.C. and played Matches against Dandenong and Moorabbin Umpires' Association, which were most enjoyable.

REGISTRATION SECRETARY'S REPORT

As Registration Secretary of the largest Cricket Association in Victoria, it makes me wonder how we have become so. When in an Association of this proportion we have Teams losing Semis and Finals because of breaches of the Rules, it makes me wonder all the more.

However, I have to report that Ringwood RSL in the "E" Grade Semi and Bedford-RHS in the "C" Grade Final played Players who were not

eligible. I do not know how the Officials of those two Clubs felt when telling their Players of these breaches, but I assure you that these were the two hardest tasks I have had to perform for some time.

I have pleaded with the Clubs over my years as Registration Sec, as have other members of the Executive, to make sure that their Officials are conversant with the Rules and I take no pride in having

to take away Points or fine Teams for rule breaches. For instance, fines amounting to \$95 were incurred by Clubs for not having their

Players Lists in on time and this, after your Executive gave a little assistance over that of other years, by having addressed envelopes

distributed to the Clubs. I hope that in Season 1973 - 74, we will see some improvement, 100% would be very pleasing to the Executive,

I feel sure.

Unregistered Players for the Season numbered 53, of these, 23 were in Round ONE, 10 being from one Club. Not a very good record!

So much for my complaints: in the Season just past, we saw an increase in the number of Registered Players as follows -
