SECRETARY'S REPORT

The 2000/01 season was certainly one of great change for the RDCA Juniors and consequently proved to be quite testing and challenging. While the season did not progress as smoothly as we all would have liked, it was still very productive in providing a good foundation for us to work on for coming seasons.

The Internet is a medium that is growing rapidly and will continue to do so for many years to come. It is one of the best mediums that a Sport like Cricket has to reach out to its numerous followers and for the providing and sharing of information.

It was only three seasons ago that the RDCA Juniors began to use email as means of distributing information and keeping in contact with clubs. At the time it was only a few people that saw the advantage of this, while others turned their nose up at the mere idea.

This season all except one Junior Club has an email contact and those who turned their nose up at the idea three seasons ago, are now amongst the people embracing this technology.

We are currently living in the information age and for those who take advantage of the new technology are the ones that will find that their lives become simpler. Those that choose to ignore it, will fall behind and will not enjoy the benefits.

At the first delegates meeting the Junior Executive made it quite clear, that with the introduction of the new results and registration system, there would be teething problems and that the ride would undoubtedly be bumpy.

While the ride was definitely bumpy the overwhelming positive reaction from the Junior players more than makes up for this. Through the RDCA Website and the new results system we now have Junior Players at home and school checking results, ladders and fixtures and consequently generating a larger interest in the local competition than has been possible for a number of years.

With some more time and work the system as whole will become smoother and better, with the game of cricket being the one that benefits through increased availability of information.

The one comment that I heard this season, that to me indicates and sums up the potential and benefit of the Internet, was from a local Secondary School teacher who said, "every time I walk into the computer labs at least half students are looking at their results on the RDCA Website".

As well as the change with the results and registration system, there was also a change in the approach to how the fixture was put together. In past seasons the focus has been more on ensuring an even number of home and away matches. This season the focus was to try and provide for a more even competition, with all teams playing each other at least once and eliminating teams playing each other more than once.

In the majority of cases this was achieved, although where regrading occurred there was some repeating in the fixture. However on the whole the fixture was far more even than it had been in past seasons.

As a result of the change in direction with the fixture this created the problem of an uneven amount of home and away matches in some cases. Unfortunately due to the way clubs share grounds amongst their sides it is exceptionally difficult to ensure an equitable amount of home and away matches, when trying to ensure for an even competition.

While the process is not easy the Junior Executive are determined to ensure that 2001/02 fixture is as even as it was this season, but with a more equitable distribution of home and away matches.

On the field the 2000/01 season was definitely again another successful season for the RDCA Juniors. The Representative Sides again performed successfully with the IAJCC Under 12 side making the Semi-Finals under the guidance of Michael Duke and Phil Lovell, the Mitchell Shield side made the quarter finals for the first time ever under the guidance of Graeme Merrett and Chris Foden, the IAJCC Under 14's also made it to the Semi Finals under the guidance of John Springett, and the Under 16's made it to the Grand Final under the guidance of John Higgins and Ian Jones.

Much praise must be directed to the coaches and team managers of these sides who gave up all the Sundays in November and December to select and train these sides, as well as two weeks in January and a couple of Sundays

in February for actual playing of matches. They all have done a fantastic job and their efforts are very much appreciated by the players, parents and the RDCA.

Congratulations to all players that played this season, especially to those players that were fortunate enough to make it to the finals. Well done also to all players who received awards at the RDCA Junior Presentation Night.

The 2000/01 season did not happen without the hard work of the Junior Executive. It was the efforts of Peter Kaspar, Jeff Luscombe, Michael Duke, Stuart Minetti, Daryl Watson, John Higgins and Paul Craddock that contributed to the success of the season. Without such hard working individuals the RDCA Juniors just would not happen and is something that A LOT of people need to realise.

The Junior Committee is appointed by the at the Annual General Meeting. We are all volunteers giving up large amounts of our time, just like the numerous club officials, of which many of us are also. It is not our mission to make life as difficult as possible for clubs, we are simply trying to ensure that any decision we make is beneficial to ALL, not particular clubs and individuals.

It is very disappointing at times to see people get too caught up in their own clubs affairs and overlook the bigger picture. It becomes even more tragic when members of the Junior Committee are subject to personnel threats and abuse and is something that if it continues will see very few people VOLUNTEER their time.

As I have previously stated we are all here for the same reason, we are all human, we are all volunteers, we are all prone to making mistakes, and most importantly we are all here for Junior Cricket. This is something we ALL need to remember.

In closing I would like to recognise two members of the Executive who have indicated they will not be standing for the coming season.

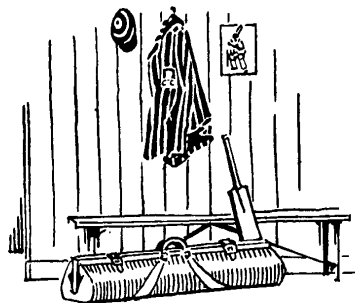

RDCA REPRESENTATIVE TEAMS

Each season the RDCA enters three teams into the Inter Association Junior Cricket Carnival (IAJCC). This Carnival, like Hatch and Dowling, is played over January and is played against associations all over Victoria. The aim of this Carnival is to give those players who missed out on participating in the Hatch or Dowling Competitions an opportunity to play representative cricket.

Once again we entered a team into the 'Keith Mitchell Shield' Competition which is run by the Victorian Metropolitan Cricket Union. This competition is probably best described as the equivalent of Hatch and Dowling Shield for Under 12's.

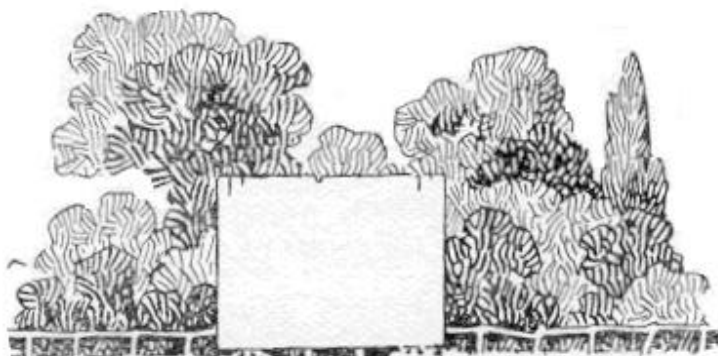
As in past seasons we again experienced significant success with all sides make the finals for the first time ever. The Under 12 side lost to their nemesis Williamstown in the Semi-Final, while the Under 14 side tied their Semi-Final and the Under 12 KM Shield Side also tied their quarter final. The Under 14 side finished lower on the ladder so as a result were knocked out of the finals.

The Under 16's were the most successful side for the carnival going all the way to the Grand Final only to miss out by 10 runs.

In the situation where a bye occurs in one of the grades in the IAJC Carnival a side known as the Presidents XI is usually formed to fill this gap. This Presidents XI is generally made up of players from the RDCA, FTGDCA and YVCA. In this seasons Carnival the President's XI filled the gap in the Under 16 Grade and the following players from the RDCA were selected in this side: Luke Caratelli, Phil Cross, Matt Goss, Jayden Jennings, Julian Fussell, and Patrick Warman.

As well as the above Carnivals the RDCA also played matches against the City of Moorabin Cricket Association and the Box Hill Reporter Cricket Association. In these matches we experienced mixed results, but the key aim is to provide the players with an extra opportunity to represent their association, which they did exceptionally well.

The RDCA would like to congratulate all players who played Representative Cricket for the RDCA this season and commend them all on their performances and the way they went about representing their association. Special thanks must also go to all the parents who helped transport the players all over the State and especially to the coaches and team managers who gave up their time to give these players the opportunity to play representative cricket.

The 'Clive Fairbairn Shield' is an award that is presented to clubs for overall success. It takes into account the success of every team from a particular club.

The following are the rules which governs the determination of this award:

31 (c) Clive Fairbairn Perpetual Club Championship

- (i) Points are to be awarded to teams fielded in competitive grades by multiplying the corresponding number of points from the following table by the number of premierships points for each team as they appear on the premierships ladder at the end of the home and away games.

U16/1, U14/1 & U12/1 - 10 points

U16/2, U14/2 & U12/2 - 7 points

U16/3, U14/3 & U12/3 - 6 points

U16/4, U14/4 & U12/4 - 5 points

U16/5, U14/5 & U12/5 - 3 points

- (ii) The total number of points thus gained by all competitive teams fielded by the club for all the home and away games of the season shall then be divided by the number of competitive teams so fielded to calculate an average.

- (iii) The Total Championship Points will then be determined by the first multiplying the average calculated in (ii) above by 0.1 (10%), then multiplying by the number of teams fielded and finally using the result to the average calculated in (ii) above.

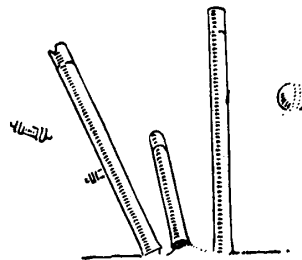

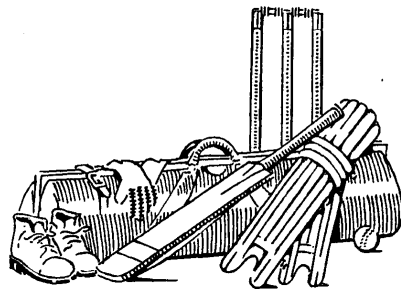
