JUNIOR REGISTRATION SECRETARY'S REPORT.

During season 89/90 there were 72 clearances granted by the junior side of the R.D.C.A. There were 788 new registrations processed by the junior registration secretary. A total of 28 players were found to be unregistered, over-aged or higher graded at certain parts of the season. There were six clubs to lose points because of this.

With an increase in the number of teams playing this season the amount of fines has decreased which is a good sign for the Junior Administrators who have a very important role to play in the success of their club.

Finally to all the Premiership sides congratulations and to all the other sides that participated in the juniors well done. Let's hope that season 1990/91 is an enjoyable season for all clubs involved and that our numbers do not decrease. The long term future of the R.D.C.A. really depends a fair bit on how strong we can keep our junior competition. With the competition cricket is receiving from other sports we all must try to keep the junior side of the association as attractive and enjoyable to players as possible in order to keep the numbers of participants at a high level.

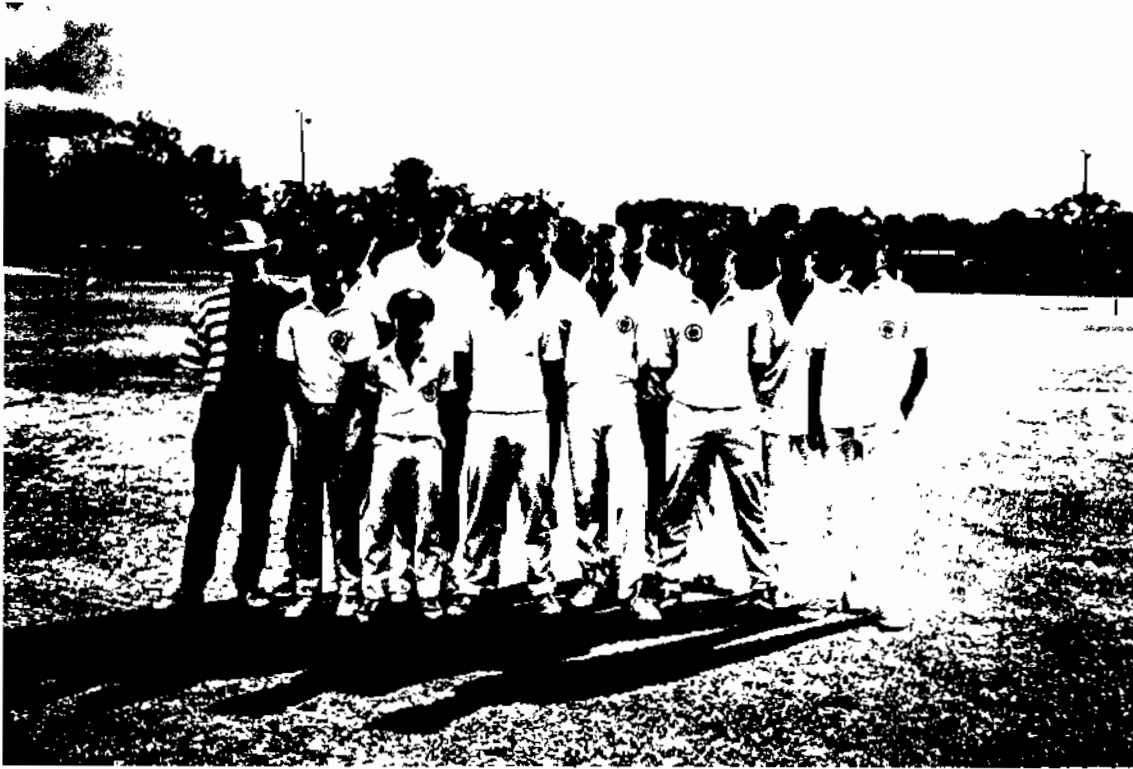
