#### SECRETARY'S REPORT

As we are approaching a new era for the Association with the anticipated early introduction of an Indoor Cricket Centre and creation of a true headquarters for the association at the Pinks Reserve complex, I am able to look back over 8 years on the RDCA Executive on a period of tremendous growth in both size and adminstrative expertise.

In that time the R.D.C.A. has almost doubled in size and the standard of competition has increased in leaps and bounds.

A great deal of the credit for this growth is attributable to our energetic and enthusiastic President, Bill Dean, who, in his own words, has "organised his priorities" and places the RDCA and the promotion of cricket high on his list.

The Executive members have been greatly influenced by Bill's enthusiasm, and have been modulded into an efficient team performing many varied and complicated duties which the majority of R.D.C.A. members are unaware.

Last season saw an ever increasing tendency to "knock" the Executive, and, whilst we acknowledge that constructive criticism is warranted at times, the personal attacks which are becoming prevelant, cannot be condoned - as one Club member, who faced the Tribunal at the end of last season, found cut.

The Executive welcomes constructive criticism through the proper channels. We know that everybody cannot be pleased all the time, Our responsibility is to the whole Association and not just to one Club or individual. Please

think of this when next contemplating an Executive decision which may not be to your liking.

The most disappointing feature of last season's administrative duties was the number of fines imposed for breach of rules which, if a little care was taken at Club level, would not have been necessary, Over \$1300 is astronomical. Surely this money could be put to better use within the Clubs as, contrary to popular belief, we would prefer not to collect any funds from this source.

To all Club Secretaries and officials who assisted throughout last season I extend my gratitude and trust their assistance will be forthcoming next season. Local Councils for their assistance in ground maintenance, finals, venues etc, have again been most helpful and I trust that Clubs have expressed their appreciation in this regard.

Finally, I thank my wife Ann for the many hours she have worked as my secretary and has put up with my many absences from home.

To all I wish a very happy and successful 1979-80 season.

#### REGISTRATION SECRETARY'S REPORT.

Season 1978-79 saw the continuation of the growth of our Association. An increase of 17 teams were registered over the previous season 128 team registrations.

There were 2841 senior players registered to play in the 145 teams - this represents an increase of 286 over last season. 161 senior clearances applications were received during the season.

The continued growth of bur Association brings with it administrator difficulties in the areas of both club and Associatiom. From the Association point of view, one of the main problems is in control of registrations and clrearances. To the end, several appeals were made to the clubs to carefully police their own records and by so doing help themselves and the Association to cut down on rule infringements. In some instances, the response was excellent, however, there were still 103 rule infringements moted by myslelf resulting in 86 fines and 17 instances of loss of points. As you can see there is plenty of room for improvement in this area.

Season 1979-80 will see some noteworthy changes in registration and team sheet arrangements and all clubs are again urged to peruse these changes to ensure that infringements are kept to a minimum.

Thank you to all clubs for their support last season, I wish all clubs and players a successful 1979-80 season.

#### JUNIOR REGISTRATION SECRETARY'S REPORT.

Season 1978-79 waw an increase of 15 junior teams, or bringing the total fielded by 37 clubs to 125. Players registered increased by 185 to 2518.

There were 28 unregistered and 11 ineligible players for the season. This compares with a total of 37 over the previous season with less temms so by ratio the situation is a little better. However, with 14 teams losing points, team sheets coming in incorrect and of course many late these is room for much improvement.

There were of course many managers and administrators who were right on the ball and to them I say well done.

My thanks go to all club officials for their co-operation during the season which also saw 91 clearance applications granted.

S<sub>t</sub>ill later in the season, other umpires left because of sickness or business commitments, so I was concerned coming up to fimals. However, as in the last couple of years, a sufficient number of volunteer umpires came along to help you and us, play the finals in the manner our R.D.C.A. expects.

There were a few reported players during the year, events we as umpires are unhappy about. In my opinion more than one of these would not have occurred had the Captain and Club shown more control of their players.

#### PINKS RESERVE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

Season 1978-79 heralded the first season of competitive cricket to be played on the turf wicket on the Alan Smith Oval at our Association headquarters, Pinks Reserve Kilsyth. For the first season wicket the pitch played as well as any wicket of the same vintage that most "experts" could remember. This was due no doubt to the great amount of work put into it by the Shire of Lillydale and our original curator Jeff Harrington, Jeff suffered heart trouble and had to pull out during the season by he played a major part in the early preparation with Association President Bill Dean also putting plenty of time into the wicket.

Next season we hope to have the adjoining synthetic wicket oval in use and the proposed pavilion to serve both grounds well under way.

After a long struggle it appears that the indoor c icket centre will be built as part of an extensive up date of the whole Kilsyth Sports Centre. the Association will run the centre and it is hoped that it will be ready for an indoor competition to start in the coming summer months.

Facilities during the past season were not up to Chandler Shield standard but we were fortunate to have the use of the Kilsyth Sports entre for afterneen tea, storage and toilets and for this we thank Don McAlpine very much.

The Association Headquarters concept is an exciting one which has and willtake time and money to finalise but when it is complete will boast of a top turf wicket oval,

a top synthetic wicket oval, pavilion and clubrooms serving both pratice and indoor competitions and will have facilities for a large spectator area and television vantage points for cameras which it is hoped will be used to televise interstate indoor competition in the future.

Many individuals efforts marred play on both sides and given fine weather the match proved to be a great social outing for all who took part. So we need a couple of top players in their prime on the Executive this year or else, true to form, I will have backed another loser.
