PRESIDENTS REPORT

Despite the weather and ground conditions delaying the commencement of games in season 96/97, it was pleasing that once under way the competition progressed quite satisfactorily.

Historically, the first two rounds of the season are the basis for ratification of grading and it is therefore most important that they be played. The limited availability of grounds in playable condition created some organisational difficulties but we managed to achieve our aim and the committee was most appreciative of the efforts of club administrators and team managers in this regard.

Last year I mentioned that over recent years there had been an alarming trend of clubs not working to foster junior ranks and this had resulted, in some instances, in having no junior teams at all.

During 96/97, thirty(30) clubs fielded juniors and whilst, for differing reasons, we lost the participation of two clubs from previous season the pleasing aspect was that team numbers were maintained at virtually the same level (140 against 142).

Obviously some clubs work very hard to maintain their junior ranks and those efforts are reflected in the number of teams that they field. It has become quite clear that the Vic Hit program, which commenced three seasons ago, will be the major source for future recruitment of players into our junior ranks. There are now quite a number of our clubs who are involved in the conduct of this program and we congratulate them for their initiative and effort. Those that are not would do well to look at the feasibility of becoming involved.

Prior to the commencement of recent seasons, we have arranged Level 1 Coaching Accreditation courses. At the last Annual Rules Meeting it became compulsory to have a certain number of accredited coaches in forthcoming seasons. The response from clubs was very positive with a total of sixty eight people attending and fifty four achieving the certificate. Thanks to a Victorian Cricket Association subsidy we were able to keep the cost per attendee to a figure substantially below that previously incurred.

The disturbing aspect of the season were the instances where the committee had to penalise clubs, either by loss of points or fines, for breaches of rules and/or procedures in completing/lodging appropriate paperwork. Fines to junior clubs totalled in excess of \$1300 for the season and it was most unfortunate that, in at least one instance, loss of points meant a team missed playing in the finals. We ask all club administrators to make a big effort, to implement procedures which will eliminate such occurrences, and thus save your club valuable funds and avoid extreme disappointment of players.

A number of clubs raised their concern on the issue of scores not appearing in local newspapers. I personally had many conversations with the sports editor and the Senior body also pursued the matter but to little or no avail. The senior executive has delegated a sub committee to meet with newspaper management in a endeavour to rectify the situation for forthcoming season.

In seasons past there was some apathy from clubs with regard to providing finals umpires. I am pleased to say that the response this year was fantastic and we understand that in general the standard was good. Thank you to those who provided services and club administrators for their organising and we hope for a similar response in the coming season.

The feedback from clubs on conduct of Presentation night was very positive and I take this opportunity to again congratulate those teams and individuals who achieved the highest honours. We were again thankful to Paul Attfield from Topline sports for trophy sponsorship and his efforts in arranging Ian Wrigglesworth as guest speaker on the night.

Our thanks also to the Veterans association for donating a perpetual shield relative to U.16 Inter Association games-against Traralgon. The Vets body has indicated that it is willing to provide substantial assistance to fostering the Junior Association and we will be working on the best ways to utilise such support.

Finally, my thanks to fellow committeemen for their efforts during the season. Whilst clubs may not always be happy with some decisions made you should be appreciative of the contribution these people make to the successful running of this association

I look forward to seeing you in the coming season.

REGISTRATION SECRETARY REPORT - 1996/97

In my first year as Registration Secretary I quickly learnt about the frustration of maintaining and policing the registration records of all Clubs.

Confronted with an antiquated computer system was the first hurdle, as I had to acquaint myself with the idiosynscries of the old recording system and then adjust that more modern and updated computer system. The major problem in the transition was the uncertainty that all previous registration had been accurately recorded and transposed to the new system at the time of integration. It was initially quite frustrating to approach Clubs who had previously registered players with requests to do so again because the RDCA records did not confirm it.

After the initial onslaught of new registrations the administrative function settled down. I'm pleased to report that there was a total of 531 new registrations in 1996/97 with a further 93 players granted clearances from both within and outside RDCA. The loss of three junior Clubs (Knox Garden, South Croydon & Eastfield) did not curb the growth of our junior division. A total of 142 teams were entered in the 4 age divisions, involving approximately 1800 boys & girls in competitive & non-competitive cricket. The interest in cricket has increased dramatically, particularly with Clubs who have become involved in the VCA supported Milo Have-A-Go program which is targeting 5-10 year children.

My major and most time consuming task for the season, was to analyse the audit reports issued after the completion of each round, checking the validity of registrations and the general accuracy of information supplied in the Match Result Sheet. Most Clubs incurred fines for incorrect completion of these reports eg: incorrect spelling of names etc. Mid season I alerted all Clubs of the common and regular mistakes that were occurring. I strongly recommend that Clubs appoint a reliable person from within to check and co-ordinate the completion of all Match Result Sheets, which I believe will significantly reduce the amount of fines issued.

I have included with this report, a table of all Clubs detailing the new registrations received and clearances processed.
