The 1988 89 season within the Junior ranks of the R.D.C.A.Inc. once again proved to be a successful and rewarding one for those people involved in the overall administration of the Association.

It is quite important that the Executive has a turnover of people moving through its ranks, this ensures that there is an up to date approach to the running of Junior Cricket in our Association. The new faces in season 1988/89 were Neville Bradshaw and David Hunter, both gave excellent service to the Executive.

Once the season got underway it proved to be a successful one. There was very little trouble in the day to day running of the competition, and the standard of cricket was, once again, very high.

From an administrative point of view there was two areas of concern. Firstly at the beginning of the season we again experienced trouble in securing enough young cricketers to fill the teams nominated by clubs. We as an Executive have addressed the problem, clubs and team managers must also come to terms with the fact that they must give each and every boy the chance to take an active part in the game each Saturday.

Secondly at the end of the season the Executive experienced the lack of support by a number of clubs in not supplying umpires for the finals series. Teams playing in the finals benefit from the fact that we have, in the past, been able to supply every game with two impartial umpires. If last seasons trend continues some games in season 89/90's final series will be without neutral umpires. That would be sad.

In closing I would like to pass on my thanks to all the members of the Junior Executive for their continued support. My thanks also goes to every club within the Association, the Junior Administrators, Team Managers and players for their input into each Saturdays game of cricket. It is what happens on the ground each Saturday morning that gives the members of the Junior Executive their rewards for their efforts.

JUNIOR REGISTRATION SECRETARY'S REPORT.

During season 88/89 there were 93 clearances granted by the junior side of the R.D.C.A. Over 400 new registrations were processed by the junior registration secretary. There were a total of 38 players played who were found to be either unregistered, over-age or higher graded at certain stages of the season. Nine of these resulted in loss of points. Many of these occurred when clubs played boys in an under 12 competitive grade after playing non-competitive. Also some clubs still tend to forget after christmas about higher graded players not being eligible to play in a lower grade in the same age group. All junior administrators must place in the front of each score book a list of eligible players and the computer spelling of each boy for that grade and keep reminding and checking that all their team managers are using this list when filling out the result sheet.

I believe that the importance of an efficient Junior Administrator is not fully realised by all clubs in the final outcome of the success of their club. I suppose the St. Andrews club would be the prime example of what finally eventuates from very good junior administration.

Finally to all the Premiership sides congratulations and to all the other sides that participated in the juniors well done. Let's hope that season 1989/90 is an enjoyable season for all clubs involved and that our numbers do not decrease. The long term future of the R.D.C.A. really depends a fair bit on how strong we can keep our junior competition. With the competition cricket is receiving from other sports we all must try to keep the junior side of the association as attractive and enjoyable to players as possible in order to keep the numbers of participants at a high level.
