## JUNIOR SECRETARY'S REPORT

Well finally the season is over and as soon as it is we start to look ahead towards the next one.

Right from the time of last years Annual General Meeting for those people elected on to the Executive, the job began and for those elected this time around its already time to go again.

First there was meetings of the Grading Committee, the delightful gentleman who take your maze of team nominations and options for grounds and try to shuffle and bend what at times seems unpliantable into a smooth and easily negotiated thing called the fixture.

As well as Grading Committee Meetings which at times take the form of a World of Sport Panel where total and utter confusion reign there are the normal monthly meetings of the Junior Executive held before supper where matters vital to the smooth running of the Association in which your club plays are sorted out and acted upon so as to keep things moving along.

Meetings are held before the Season begins to plan the Inter-Association Carnival and a couple of Junior Officials also sit on the Senior Executive of the Association so as to be kept informed of matters vital to them and then in turn return their contributions towards the overall running of the Association.

Finally the season begins after a couple of early meetings designed to iron out problems with the fixture and teams pulling out and letting team managers know exactly what is going on and their role on Saturday mornings. This is only the end of October and already since July about 10 nights out have been spent, about 100 circulars mailed, 60 to 70 3 page handouts prepared and up to 100 telephone calls have been answered.

Yet even after many bouts of early season frustration I can now look back on the season just been and say that I've enjoyed the position and so I hand it over to my successor in the coming year - I wish you luck, You'll need it.

To the members of the Junior Executive, thanks for all the assistance you were able to give me especially while I was still studying and congratulations for a job well done which revealed many highlights:

NO Junior player was reported for misconduct.

Croydon North won the 16-1 flag.

RDCA Under 12s won the Carnival Championship.

Norwood won the 14-1 flag.

Ringwood's Dowling Sheild side which boasted many RDCA players was successful in winning the Dowling Shield for the second successive year.

Croydon's Hatch side won through to the semi-finals.

Warrantdyte's Reece Kline was named Victorian Under 16 captain.

Kilsyth won the Under 12 flag.

RDCA Under 16s defeated Goulburn Valley Under 16s.

Richard Armstrong from St. Andrews and Stephen LeGet from Norwood also represented Victoria's under 16 side.

Ringwood won the Clive Fairbairn Club Championship.

Over 50 centuries were scored in the Junior Competition this year.

JUNIOR REGISTRATION & RECORDS SECRETARIES' REPORT

The 1984 - 85 season saw the workload involved in this area divided to spread the responsibility within the Junior Executive.

This approach worked very well during the season and enabled the members of the Junior Executive to keep a fresh approach to the running of the Junior Section of the Association.

With rule changes relating to team nominations, and a great deal of pre-season planning, the Junior Competition got away with a small number of team changes. This is an area where there will always be problems as it is extremely hard for clubs to gauge the coming and going of their junior players.

The association provided the administration for an increasing number of junior players to be involved in cricket in the past season. In excess of 3,400 players were registered in the three age divisions, with many more playing in the under 12 grade 5. These players not having to be registered. A total of 41 Clubs fielded 154 competitive sides, and 24 non-competitive sides.

. During the season a total of 140 players sought clearances to other clubs within the association. In the main these were dealt with by the clubs involved in an efficient manner. Unfortunately there will always be problems with unregistered or ineligible players, this leads to fines or loss of points. In season 84-85 there were 49 unregistered players, 4 overage players and 7 ineligible players. This resulted in 18 teams losing hard earned match points, whilst the remaining teams were fined.

Generally season 84-85 was one which ran smoothly thanks to the co-operation of Junior Administrators of the Clubs within the Association.

Congratulations must go to all the boys that played representative cricket during the past season. Not only is it a great honor, but a stepping stone to bigger and better things.
