President's Report - Timothy Court

The 2011/2012 season when it was all said and done, can definitely be viewed as a success. The biggest issue encountered during the season was the rain, with interruptions encountered at both the start and end of the season. Despite these interruptions we were still able to complete the season with minimal loss of playing days.

For the second season in a row there was a continued focus on player retention and finding ways to increase participation numbers. At the conclusion of the 2010/2011 season the GARP Committee was formed by the Board of Management to assist with addressing these issues across the association. This group has worked hard on these issues and to date we have seen the development of a Club Support Manual for Clubs, the introduction of Split Innings Cricket to the Junior Competition and a lot more ongoing hard work that is will many more positive developments be put into action soon.

It was very pleasing to see the Clubs take to the Split Innings format with a very positive approach and in return we received overwhelming positive feedback, which would suggest that this format has made a significant impact. Even more pleasing is that other Associations will be following the RDCA's initiative this coming season and introducing similar formats.

One of the next focuses of the Board of Management and the GARP Committee is to increase promotion and exposure of the game, especially at the lower Junior level, with the goal of increasing our numbers. As part of this exercise, we have met with Cricket Victoria on three occasions, including a meeting with Cricket Victoria CEO Tony Dodemaide. We have also attended the Cricket Australia Road show where issues affecting local Cricket were discussed. Since our first meeting with Cricket Victoria we have seen a very big shift in focus of their strategies with a shift of focus back to Clubs and Associations and assisting them with growth and retention.

We are currently discussing a number of strategies both internally and with Cricket Victoria that we hope to implement towards the end of August and beginning of September. It is hoped that these will increase awareness of the game and more importantly participation in In2Cricket, Under 10 and the Under 12 competition for the coming season.

The RDCA Junior Committee again ran the T20 Competition. and This season saw the introduction of an Under 14 Age Group that proved to be very popular. We came close to getting an Under 12 Competition up and running but it was not to be. The Grand Final of the T20 Competition was once again played out at JW Manson Reserve and well hosted by St Andrews CC. It was great to see all three finals played at the same venue.

The Under 10 Round Robin Carnival was also held again this season and for the first time in its history every club was in attendance. A great night was had by all and Croydon Rages were again magnificent as hosts of the event.

The RDCA once again participated in the VMCU Carnival with six teams. Justin Hansen took on the role as Coordinator and received a Baptism of fire, as the role involved a little more than he first expected. At the end of the day the, Carnival was huge success thanks to his efforts. The highlight of the Carnival was the winning of the Beitzel Shield. A big thanks must go to: Bill Stafford, Sue Cunningham, Deon Voss, Luke Clarke, Paul Pleming,

Steve Lester, Lincoln Grigg, Jeff Barr, Danny Black, Russell O'Toole, Steve Minns, Danielle Hancock for their assistance as Coaches and Team Managers.

With some modifications to the format, the RDCA Junior Presentation night again ran smoothly and quickly. The night was again hosted by Justin Nelson who ensured the night was always moving and was completed in record time. At presentation night we saw the introduction of another new initiative of the RDCA Junior Committee which was the recognition of volunteers. Volunteers who have been involved with their Junior Club for 5, 10 or 15+ years were all recognized for their contribution to the game. Without the hard work of these volunteers many clubs would not have teams, so it is only fitting the RDCA recognizes these milestones each season.

In closing I would like to thank the RDCA Junior Committee for their efforts in the season just gone. John Springett was again outstanding in his role as Junior Secretary and his 10 years of experience in this role was invaluable. Justin Hansen, as already mentioned was a great asset with the running of the VMCU Carnival teams. Wayne Hartley, David Brush, Doug Beaton, Kerry Walton and Tim Sweeney were a great support in the roles on the General Committee. Special thanks to Tim Sweeney and Wayne Hartley for their extended service over the years as they both have indicated that they will be stepping off the Committee at the AGM. Ian Jones and Josh Browne were our Investigation Officers for the season and fortunately had quiet season. Finally a big thanks to my wife Rebecca for her assistance in her roles on the Junior Committee this season as well as her constant support and putting up with countless Cricket meetings.

Work is well under way for the 2012/2013 season with some structural changes already taken place which will position the RDCA Juniors in strong position for the future.

Assistant and Records Secretary Report – Rebecca Court

The 2011/2012 season was the second season the RDCA has used MyCricket and it is pleasing to report that there minimal issues with Club's entering Results and Registrations. It was also the second season in which Clearances were processed online and again there were little to no issues encountered.

This season saw 90 teams participate in our main competitive grades. This was 8 less teams than last season, with the loss of teams coming from the Under 14 and Under 16 Divisions. We had 23 teams participate in our non-competitive grades which was an increase of 3 teams from last season. We also had 26 teams participate in out midweek T20 Competition, which were four teams less than the previous season.

There were minimal fines issued for late short results and full match results which was very pleasing.

Thank you to all the Clubs and the Junior Committee for their support over the course of the season.

Putting together six junior representative sides to represent the RDCA in a relatively short period of time requires many people working together and this year proved to be no exception.

From the outset we had a plethora of volunteers and affiliates who put up their collective hands starting with our major Association sponsor Paul Attfield who hosted the early trials at his Saxons Sports facility in Gatwick Road, Bayswater North. The trials although chaotic at times went smoothly and all three Age level squads were trimmed down to approximately 30 players by the last outdoor trial.

Clive Fairbairn Shield

The 'Clive Fairbairn Shield' is an award that is presented to clubs for overall success. It takes into account the success of every team from a particular club.

The following are the rules which governs the determination of this award:

31(c)Clive Fairbain Perpetual Club Championship

i. Points are to be awarded to teams fielded in competitive grades by multiplying the corresponding number of points from the following table by the number of premiership points for each team as they appear on the premiership ladder at the end of the home and away games.

U18/1, U16/1, U14/1 & U12/1 - 10 points

U16/2, U14/2 & U12/2 - 7 points

U16/3, U14/3 & U12/3 - 6 points

U16/4, U14/4 & U12/4 - 5 points

U16/5, U14/5 & U12/5 - 3 points

- ii. The total number of points thus gained by all competitive teams fielded by the club for all the home and away games of the season shall then be divided by the number of competitive teams so fielded to calculate an average.
- iii. The Total Championship Points will then be determined by the first multiplying the average calculated in (ii) above by 0.1 (10%), then multiplying by the number of teams fielded and finally using the result to the average calculated in (ii) above.
