# PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Season 2001/02 proved to be yet another successful and interesting season. In it's never-ending endeavour to improve junior cricket the Junior Committee implemented a number of changes and initiatives, which were warmly received and will assuredly see the junior competition continue to grow.

One such change was the moving of the non-competitive grades to Friday evenings. This was an overwhelming success and as well as the addition of a number of new sides, both players and parents warmed to the concept of twilight cricket. Many more families were seen on these Friday evenings with increased enjoyment for all.

A round robin tournament was introduced for our non-competitive grades, which incorporated a number of local Milo Have-A-Go Clinics. The concept was engineered by Jeff Luscombe through his love for cricket and in particular his passion for the development of junior cricket. Thanks Jeff for the idea, the planning and organisation and your fantastic efforts on the day of the tournament. This inaugural tournament will now be expanded in the coming season to be the climax to the non-competitive season. Something for our most junior cricketers to really look forward to!

The Juniors again entered three sides (U/12, U/14, & U/16) into the Inter Association Junior Cricket Carnival and one side into the Mitchell Shield Carnival. Once again the RDCA demonstrated the strength of its junior talent with the Under 16s and Under 14s winning their competitions, the Under 12's made it to the semi-finals, while the Keith Mitchell Side also made it to the semi-finals. Many thanks must go to John Higgins, John Springett, Phill Lovell, Graeme Merrett, Chris Foden, Keith Smith and Michael Duke for ensuring the success of these representative sides. This junior talent also came to the fore with eight of the Ringwood Under 16 Dowling Shield side coming from RDCA clubs – this team finished runners-up.

Presentation Night at Yarra Valley proved to be somewhat different this year. Although the format was similar to past seasons, the audience was kept much more involved and interested through all the seasons highlights being presented via a multi-media presentation on a large screen. This drew all round praise and will continue to be developed with a number of new ideas already being considered for our next Presentation Night.

Unfortunately the season did not pass without a number of incidents that make life very difficult for the volunteers who give up their time to run the Junior Association on behalf of the clubs. We must remember that the clubs appoints these "officials". As time goes on it is becoming increasingly difficult to find volunteers to help run the Association, simply as a result of the actions of a very small minority of Junior Coordinators and parents who can only see one point of view. If this persists then the cost of running the Junior Association is going to escalate in our attempts to attract enough people to assist to run the association. Whether this happens is ultimately up to the clubs and parents. This is children's sport after all!

The Junior Committee has not been idle in the off-season and a complete review of last season has taken place. A number of initiatives are planned and will be presented to clubs at our next AGM. Tim Court has announced that he will be stepping down from the role of Secretary, which he has so ably filled for a number of seasons now. Tim won't be lost to us completely, but the demands of the busy secretarial role must give way to the development of his own career. Tim, thanks for a fantastic job – there were many initiatives introduced into the RDCA, Juniors and Seniors, for which you were either directly responsible or played a significant role in developing. Again, well done and thanks. To the other members of our hard working committee, thank you and well done. The same thanks must go to the majority of Junior Coordinators who do an excellent job in maintaining and developing our great game of cricket at junior level in Melbourne's outer eastern suburbs.

# SECRETARY'S REPORT

The last four seasons has been quite an eye opener into the amount of time and effort that is involved with the running of a Junior Association. It is amazing the amount of time and effort that people are prepared to give up and put in to provide the younger members of our society with the opportunity to participate in such a great game.

It is a real shame that the majority of clubs do not appreciate the effort that these people put in and continue to only look at things from their own point of view. These people that give up their time to assist with the running of the Junior Association are just like those people that give up their time to assist with the running of a Junior Club. Yet, so often those people running the Junior Association are treated as the enemy.

This is something that has really concerned me in the past four seasons, especially with the increasing amount of situations where decisions of the Junior Executive are challenged and members of the Executive are harassed for being part of these decisions.

In all my time on the Junior Executive I have never been involved with a decision or seen a decision that has been made without taking all the facts and the interests of all parties into consideration. When you have two feuding parties it is very difficult to reach an outcome that is mutually acceptable. This is more so the case when the two parties are only interested in themselves.

It seems to be quite often forgotten that it is the Clubs that create and endorse the rules. It is also the clubs that appoint the Junior Executive. The Junior Executive simply applies the rules that have been endorsed by the clubs. It is not possible to change rules on a whim to suit particular situations and as a result situations arise where from one point of view may seem harsh. When such situations arise it can become quite unpleasant to be told that one has lost the plot or one is not serving the best interests of Junior Cricket. The Junior Executive does not go around making decisions to destroy dreams. The Junior Executive has two levels of appeal above it and as a result must impose rules and penalties as laid out in the rules otherwise they open themselves up to have their decisions overturned.

With the ever increasing demands on peoples time it is becoming increasingly important that Clubs start to realize that the Junior Executive is simply applying the rules laid down by the clubs, because it is becoming increasingly difficult to find volunteers to fill positions on the Junior Executive, which means one of two things. An increased workload on Junior Clubs or increase in costs to enter a side to allow an increase in honoraria to attract more people to assist with the running of the Junior Association.

We are all here for the same reason !

On the whole I have thoroughly enjoyed my time as Junior Secretary and learned a hell of a lot in that time. It has been a very rewarding job and one that has brought me a lot of satisfaction to know that I have been helping to provide the opportunity for so many people to play such a great game.

I strongly encourage anyone with some spare time a desire to put something back into the game, to get involved the Junior Executive.

In closing I would like to thank everyone who has assisted and supported me over the past four seasons in the role of Junior Secretary. In particular I would like to thank Tony Gawne, Chris Willman and Jeff Luscombe who have been an enormous assistance and provided me with outstanding support.

Good luck to everyone for the 2002/03 season.

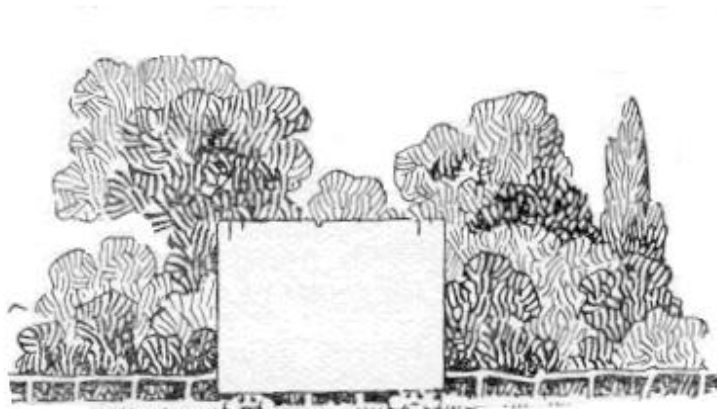

The Keith Mitchell Shield side unfortunately lost in their Semi Final, but this is the furthest the RDCA has come in the Keith Mitchell Competition in the history of the competition.

In the situation where a bye occurs in one of the grades in the IAJC Carnival a side known as the Presidents XI is usually formed to fill this gap. This Presidents XI is generally made up of players from the RDCA, FTGDCA and YVCA. In this seasons Carnival the President's XI filled the gap in the Under 16 Grade and the following players from the RDCA were selected in this side: Nick Chamberlain, Michael Cochrane, Sholto May, Justin Kaspar, Andrew McKenzie, Jonathon Reynolds, Dale Rogers, Ben Taylor, Nick Dejaeger, Julian Fussell and Liam Kilgour.

As well as the above Carnivals the RDCA also played matches against the City of Moorabin Cricket Association and the Box Hill Reporter Cricket Association. In these matches we experienced mixed results, but the key aim is to provide the players with an extra opportunity to represent their association, which they did exceptionally well.

The RDCA would like to congratulate all players who played Representative Cricket for the RDCA this season and commend them all on their performances and the way they went about representing their association. Special thanks must also go to all the parents who helped transport the players all over the State and especially to the coaches and team managers who gave up their time to give these players the opportunity to play representative cricket.

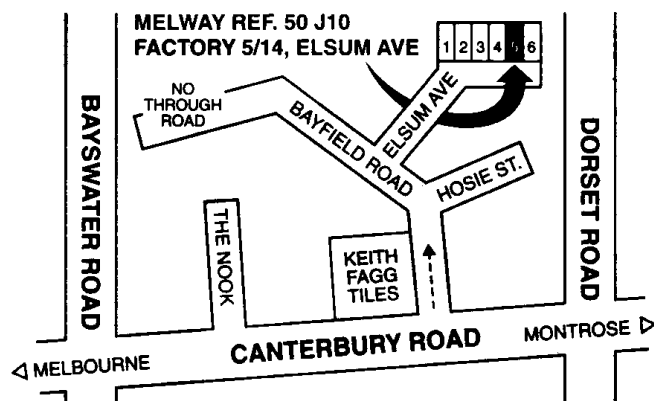

# CLIVE FAIRBAIRN SHIELD

The 'Clive Fairbairn Shield' is an award that is presented to clubs for overall success. It takes into account the success of every team from a particular club.

The following are the rules which governs the determination of this award:

31 (c) Clive Fairbairn Perpetual Club Championship

- (i) Points are to be awarded to teams fielded in competitive grades by multiplying the corresponding number of points from the following table by the number of premierships points for each team as they appear on the premierships ladder at the end of the home and away games.
  - U16/1, U14/1 & U12/1 - 10 points
  - U16/2, U14/2 & U12/2 - 7 points
  - U16/3, U14/3 & U12/3 - 6 points
  - U16/4, U14/4 & U12/4 - 5 points
  - U16/5, U14/5 & U12/5 - 3 points
- (ii) The total number of points thus gained by all competitive teams fielded by the club for all the home and away games of the season shall then be divided by the number of competitive teams so fielded to calculate an average.
- (iii) The Total Championship Points will then be determined by the first multiplying the average calculated in (ii) above by 0.1 (10%), then multiplying by the number of teams fielded and finally using the result to the average calculated in (ii) above.

This year's winner was **NORTH RINGWOOD CRICKET CLUB.**

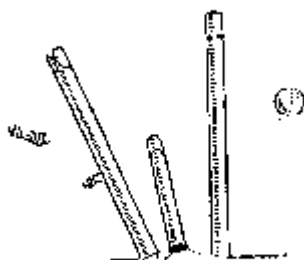

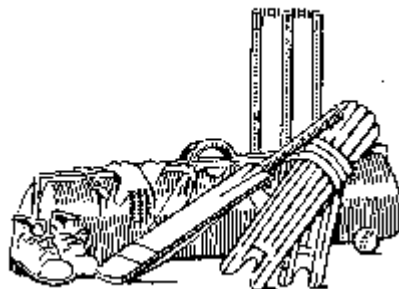
