JUNIOR REGISTRATION SECRETARY'S REPORT.

During season 1990/91 there were 74 clearances granted by the junior side of the R.D.C.A. There were 724 new registrations processed by the junior registration secretary. A total of 55 players were founded be ineligible by either being unregistered, over-aged or higher graded. There were 11 clubs to lose points because of this.

JUNIOR RESULTS REPORT 1990-91.

This being my second season involved with the R.D.C.A and the match result sheets, I anticipate the percentage of problems one could expect in a season. The main area's of concern did not changed much from last season, imbalance in scores or details missing from a result sheet, although late result sheets did shown signs of improving from previous seasons.

I may have appeared to be very critical at the start but it must be pointed out it takes two people four hours to scrutinize all of the result sheets for every round. The reason for the incomplete ladders and results during the season was due to the time it took clubs to resubmitted result sheets that were required to correct and balance team and players figures.

One area of concern that we detected was the apparent manipulation of result sheets. The R.D.C.A had to examine some score books during this season and it was quite obvious that figures in some of those books were not the same as those on the result sheet for that corresponding game. The R.D.C.A has been informed by other cricket associations that we are far to lenient in our methods of scrutinizing results sheets. We may have to follow the hard line other association have been forced to adopt to correct these problems if they continue next season.

I would like to thank Paul Craddock for his help during the season it allowed me the chance to deal with other areas that needed attention during the season. Paul was very prompt and he made an outstanding effort at his first attempt at this very crucial area of cricket administration. Also thanks to other members of the R.D.C.A committee for their time and efforts during the season.

Congratulations to all premierships and R.D.C.A trophy winners, also congratulations to everyone who played a part in the organization of a team. We had a very high standard of cricket played in our association this season and It shows that the time and effort of these people has been a positive contribution towards cricket. Hopefully we can continue to allow all young cricketers the chance to play cricket in the biggest and best cricket association.

COACH REPORT

Against strong opposition from all other Victorian Sub District Cricket Association Clubs, the Croydon Cricket Club (U14) Hatch Shield team won the title of the best Under 14 Cricket Team in Victoria. This is the third time a Croydon team has been the champion team having previously won in the 1980-81 and 1985-86 seasons.

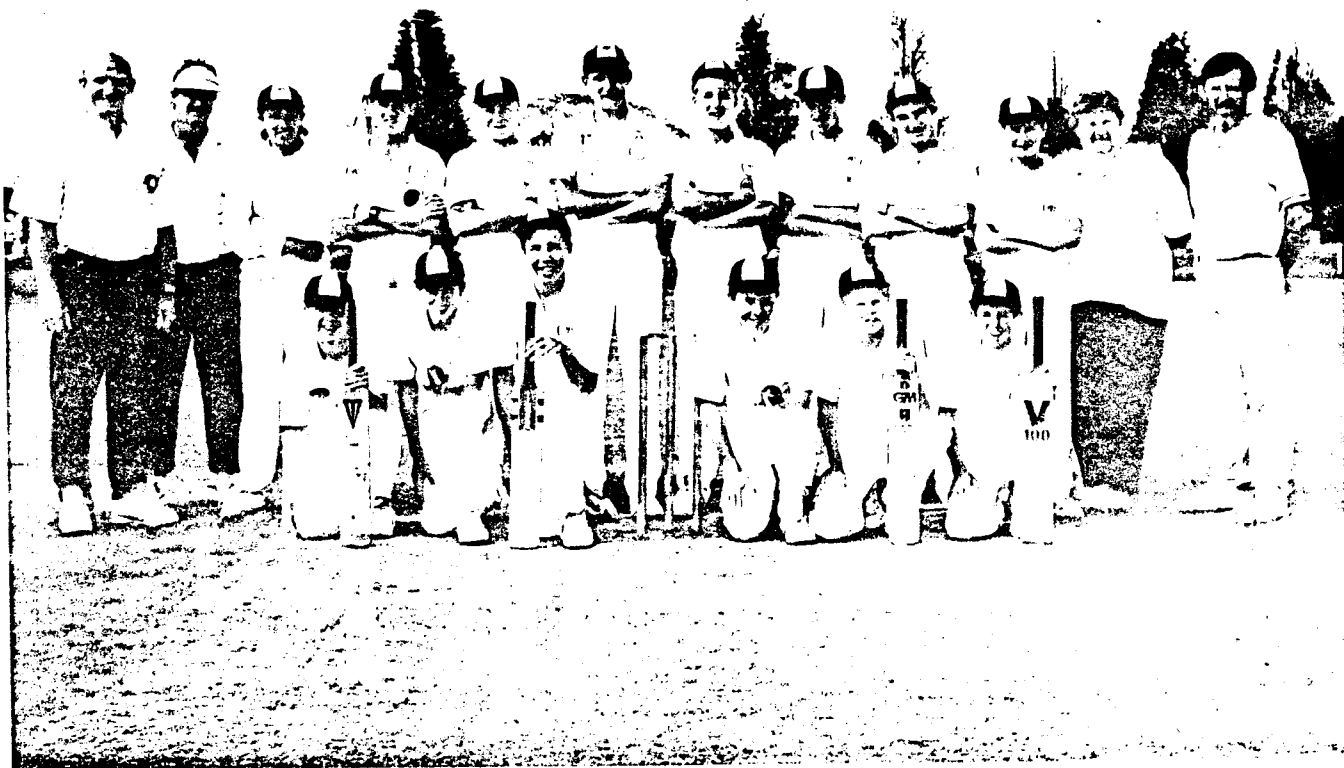
After finishing on top of the eastern section in January the team won the right to play in preliminary finals games and after defeating Melton in semi-final, the right to play Bayswater in the Grand Final at Broadmeadows on Sunday 3/2/91. The team expected a hard game because Bayswater had comfortably beaten Croydon in the last round. Without offering any excuses, Croydon players were "flat" in that match after a hard fought game against Kew the previous day.

In a tense and high standard finals match Croydon were the victors after passing Bayswater's score of 6/131cc with four overs remaining. Short details were: Croydon 6/135 (Pennington 33no, D'Andrea 27, Doyle 20) def. Bayswater 6/131cc (Jamieson 29no, Rafter 3/19).

Notable performances for Croydon during the series were from Paul D'Andrea 266 runs, Brendan Rafter 12 wickets, Damien Nott 10 wickets and Andrew Pennington who in true captain's performance not only made 238 runs during the series but also won the Man of the Match award in the Final.

The RDCA can be extremely proud of the performance of all representative players who have gained invaluable experience which will be beneficial in progressing to higher levels in their cricketing careers.

INTER ASSOCIATION CRICKET CARNIVAL

The I.A.C.C in January completed it's eleventh carnival for junior cricketers. Originally the competition was for Under 12 and Under 14 cricketers who represented their associations in a higher standard of cricket than the normal inter club competition.

Four years ago the C.U.O.V took over the running of the Under 12 competition the Keith Mitchell Shield. The I.A.C.C then decided to introduce a Under 16 competition.

The role of the I.A.C.C is to encourage junior cricketers to play the game at a more competitive level. The competition is primarily intended for those players who miss out on selection in either Dowling Shield and Hatch Shield competition

The RDCA has made a significant contribution to the success of the I.A.C.C, having been involved since it's inception. On several occasion the RDCA has provided a second team to fill a bye in one of the grades and this year did so in the Under 16s. With 19 boys from the RDCA playing in various Dowling sides and 13 in its first X1, which reached the finals and a further 13 boys playing in the second X1, the RDCA can boast a very high standard of cricketers in its Under 16 ranks. The same can be said of the Under 14s where RDCA boys played Hatch for Croydon and Baywater, both of these reaching the final with Croydon the victors, and the RDCA side winning the IACC Under 14 final.

Currently, 7 associations compete in the IACC and we are constantly seeking out newcomers essentially because we believe there are a great number of boys, all over Melbourne and in the closer country areas, capable of performing well at this level.

The major difficulty faced by associations is the availability of adults to take on the roles of Team Managers and taxi drivers. In this regard the RDCA has always had great support from the parents of the cricketers selected to play.

Not to be forgotten is the contribution of the umpires. The RDCA Umpires Association has always made its members available for carnival matches and Mr Ron Ellis has been a strong supporter of our competition.

There are of course, far too many parents and officials, to mention by name in a report such as this, however the IACC would like to express its sincere appreciation to all those who have assisted over the years and we look forward to the continued support of the RDCA in the future.
