I must also bring to your attention the sportsmanship of all finals teams in the Under 14 Grade 5, where Chirnside Park, Warrandyte and Norwood Team Managers agreed as a body to the playing of some junior cricketers under Rule 11 throughout the finals series.

I believe that this is what our junior cricket is all about --- providing an enjoyable atmosphere, free of bitterness, for the boys to <u>participate</u> to the best of their ability, and I **wou**ld be happy for this spirit to continue on through our cricket next season and into the future.

I have decided to step down from the position of your President.

I thank you for the opportunity you have given me to put something back into this great concept of junior cricket --- the competition where, I trust, many other youngsters will also find great satisfaction in the future.

DUNIOR SECRETARY'S REPORT

Season 87/88 saw a number of changes take place within the Dunior Executive, a new Secretary, Registration Secretary and Records Secretary, along with new members to the Committee. With such a large reshuffle of a committee you would expect that there would be some teething problems, but I am happy to report that this was not the case. This I attribute to the fine tuned mechanism that has been setup over the past few seasons.

The past season was treated kindly by the weather in comparison to the last couple of seasons, and apart from the new school holidays giving us a set back we were able to start the season almost on time and continue the cricket right through to the end of the season without to much fuss.

The new rules relating to the conditions of play for one and two day games were well received by all Clubs, and in most instances, there was more cricket played than had been the case in previous seasons. Another plus for our cricket was the conditions of play that were drawn up for the finals series, these eliminated the alement of doubt that sometimes crept into the running of some finals matches. With a little more polish I feel that these conditions will be used for many seasons to come.

Season 67/88 saw a decline in the number of teams feiledd in our competition. This did not detract from the qualitity of our competition, but in fact I believe it improved it. There were less forfeits and fewer teams playing with less than 11 players than in previous seasons, this must improve the cricket our players are involved in.

There were many highlights in the season, amongst these were:-

Dur continuing involvement in Inter-Association games.

The success of the new rules for conditions of play.

A finals series played without drama.

The Presentation Night which again was a great success.

A Junior Executive that once again worked tirelessly to provide a sound competition.

I would like to take this opportunitity to thank those people that made season 87/88 enjoyable for me, the dedicated members of the Junior Executive, Junior Administrators, Team Managers and Players. All these people have contributed to the success of the Ringwood District Ericket Association's Junior Competition.

In closing I would like to pay tribute to our President of many years, Sill Wilkins. Bill has decided to run for President of the Senior body, should he be successful then he will no longer be with the Junior Executive. Over the years Bill has been a great inspiration to those involved with Junior Cricket, he will be a great loss to our ranks.

From all members of the Junior Executive, past and present, thanks for your leadership.

DUNIOR REGISTRATION SECRETARY'S REPORT

Season 87/88 saw 38 clubs field 145 compétitive teams and 16 noncompetitive teams, providing cricket for approximately 2000 juniors.

A total of 78 clearances were received, with 792 new registrations being processed. Clubs are still incurring many unnecessary fines which could be reduced with a lot more emphasis being placed by Junior Administrators onto their various team managers to follow certain proceedures when filling out result sheets, and then ansuring delivery to appropriate location on time.

A list of all players eligible for that age group with the computerised spelling of each player should be fixed into the scorebook. Also an up to date list of games played in that age group and grade should be fixed into the scorebook.

Attached is a complete list of clubs and their fines for various reasons during 87/88. As it can be seen there are clubs that can keep the fines down to a very small amount. This certainly decreases my work load and it means also that the position they have been delegated by their club is being adequately administered.

Finally I would like to offer my congratulations to all the clubs winning premierships, also to all the clubs that competed in the various grades well done, hoping that in 87/88 cricket season you achieved something through your involvement in cricket that brought you enjoyment.

During the 1987/88 season the RDCA Junior Executive undertook to select teams for Representative games and Carnival games over the Christmas break. As in previous years it involves a great deal of work for the Selection Committee, but is most enjoyable and worthwhile.

This season we played Representative games against Shepparton Junior Cricket Association in the Under 14 and Under 16 age divisions. On the same day we had Under 16's, 14's and 12's teams playing against the Fern Tree Gully Cricket Association, all these games were played in November. In early December an Under 16 team played our first Representative game against the Dandenong District Cricket Association. February saw the ROCA play host to the Goulbourn Valley Cricket Association at Jubilee Park, this match was played at Under 16 level. Due to the committment of the Managers, Parents and excellent play by the boys we won all of these games. In January we feilded teams in the Under 12's, Under 14's and Under 16's competition setup by the Inter-Association Cricket Carnival. The Under 16 and Under 14 teams played in the semi-finals and the Under 12 team made it through to the Grand Final.

The RDCA had 12 boys that represented the Croydon Cricket Club in the R.M.Hatch series, this team also played off in the Grand Final. Somewhere in the vicintity of 25 Under 16 boys from the RDCA also represented various V.C.A. clubs in the Dowling Sheild Competition.

It was a most successful season for the RDCA and shows that the standard of play in our association is very high. I would like to thank my co-selectors, all the hard working Managers the parents who presented the boys so well and finally thanks to the players who performed so well and made the RDCA proud of their efforts.
