PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The season just past, 2003/03, proved to be (as usual) a successful season in most regards. The Junior Committee experienced a significant change with the continued loss of very experienced people. Fortunately, capable people stepped forward to fill the breach, but like all things new, our newcomers took some time to "learn the ropes". Nevertheless, the junior competition was able to function without any disruption. It should be noted that the loss of these experienced people is not through disenchantment or dissatisfaction, rather through natural attrition, people moving onto other areas of interest or simply needing a rest.

Pre-season there was a significant revamp of one area of our rules covering the limitations of batting and bowling within the various age groups and divisions. These appeared to be well accepted as they were aimed at providing the opportunity for the more talented players to spend more time at the crease batting or bowling or in the lower grades, providing more opportunity for participation by all.

Our round robin tournament for our non-competitive grades, so successful last season was unfortunately cancelled due to weather this season. The committee is investigating alternatives to its timing and format for season 2003/04.

The Inter-Association Junior Carnival played in January of each season was revamped somewhat with it now coming under the control of the VMCU. As in seasons past there were two U12s, one U14s and one U16s. Fittingly the founder of this carnival, Josh Browne, has had the second Under 12 competition named after him giving due recognition to the incredible effort put in by Josh over many years. Our boys and girls again acquitted themselves admirably, reflecting both the strength of our Association and the quality of coaching at a club level.

Both our U12s made their respective Grand Finals, but although not taking that final step, performed very well. Our U16s took a couple of games to find their feet and just missed out on making the finals. The U14s proved to be our best performers going through the competition undefeated and walking away with the premiership for the second season in a row. Well done to all players, coaches, team managers, parents and others who continue to make these carnivals enjoyable and successful. Special thanks to Michael Duke for all the (considerable) behind the scenes work necessary for our teams to participate in the carnival.

Presentation Night at Yarra Valley was again successful, running very smoothly for the entire evening. The night commenced with a cornucopia video of some action from our finals series and continued with a similar format to last year with a large screen displaying details of all award recipients. Feedback was again positive.

It would be rare that a season passes without some degree of controversy and certainly this last season had its share. I am pleased to report that we had no need to convene a tribunal, although there was the need for a couple of investigations, which were dealt with competently and without further incident. Our Association is run entirely by volunteers, as most would know. Administering the Association takes a lot of effort both from the Association level and the work required to be done by Junior Coordinators. The Junior Committee this season decided to enforce a little more rigidly the fines applicable for breaches of established procedures. As usual, in general this was well received, but there is always a small number of clubs that have difficulty in administration. What became evident was that the existing procedures at the Association level were inadequate, communications with clubs needs significant improvement, the level of fines needs review and the process for reviewing appeals against fines requires overhaul. As such the Junior Committee will undertake an appropriate complete review of this whole contentious area during the off-season. The system of fines is designed purely to ensure clubs understand and accept their responsibilities, and where breaches occur, these are quickly communicated to clubs to maximise their opportunity to correct their mistakes.

Toward the end of last season the Junior Committee undertook a detailed written survey on the clubs' view of our procedures and various topics relevant to our Junior Association. Results have been collated and presented to all clubs at a special meeting. In essence clearly the majority of clubs are very happy with how things are running. However, there have been a few areas highlighted which require review and possible changes/improvements for the future. These issues have been the focus of our Committee during the off-season.

Finally, thanks to all the committee who put in considerable effort to ensure that, in the main, our Junior Association continues to be run efficiently and effectively. Each of our committee has a role within their own club, so the additional hours volunteered to administer our Association must be highly appreciated. Michael Duke, Kevin Dawson, Jeff Luscombe, Haydn Hill, Julie Mellerick and Timothy Court all contributed in a significant way and everyone should be appropriately grateful.

I would like to leave my last word of thanks to a man who was "thrown in the deep end" at the beginning of the season. John Springett took over as Secretary from our most efficient and effective Timothy Court. John, who was not proficient in the use of computers (and would probably still say he isn't), took on the role with his usual gusto and endeavour. Although there was some early criticism from some clubs, especially around timely communication, John persevered and did a truly fabulous job. Most people are totally unaware of the hundreds of hours of work involved for the secretary spread over a season, but especially so at the beginning and end of the season. John acquitted himself exceptionally well.

And of course thanks must go to everyone involved in our junior club cricket. The thousands of volunteer hours put in by club volunteers enables literally thousands of young boys and girls to participate in, enjoy and develop skills in our great game of cricket. Thanks.

The people on this committee, who donate their time to assist in running the Junior Competition, are no different as to those who run the Juniors at club level and always do it to the best of there ability.

The VMCU Junior Carnival (previously Inter-Association) run in January requires a lot of organization in setting up the teams who participate. This season Mike Duke was asked to undertake this role and it is disappointing to hear of the criticism being aimed at him. Again, few know just how much effort is put into this job alone, as well as being a committee member. Mike starts this job in November each year and it takes a certain amount of somebody special to see it through until the end in January. Mike did a great job for which **we all** should be thankful.

Any decisions that are made by the Junior Committee are always made taking into consideration all parties involved. It is impossible to please everyone, but as the saying goes " It is possible to please everyone some of the time, but it is impossible to please everyone all the time!" Sometimes it is difficult to reach an outcome that is mutually satisfactory to all parties involved.

The Under 18s was somewhat of a disappointment in season 2002/03. It appears that due to the lack of interest shown by clubs this year, after repeated requests for clubs to nominate, that this will probably not be available in season 2003/04. At this stage the Under 18s is still on this year's fixtures, but the committee needs to know if you are interested.

Clubs must realize that the Junior Committee, when applying penalties that have been put in place by the clubs, does so because a rule has been broken. This year the Junior Committee has reviewed all fines and has brought them into alignment with the senior rules where appropriate.

I strongly encourage anyone who is prepared to make his or her time available and is willing to assist, to get involved on the Junior Committee.

In closing I would like to again thank the Junior Committee. Stuart Minetti who in my first year has made my job much easier knowing that he was always ready to assist when needed. Mike Duke for his help not only in the Carnival, but also with the Umpire Information Evenings, and Jeff Luscombe, Kevin Dawson, Haydn Hill, Julie Mellerick and Timothy Court.

CLIVE FAIRBAIRN SHIELD

The 'Clive Fairbairn Shield' is an award that is presented to clubs for overall success. It takes into account the success of every team from a particular club.

The following are the rules which governs the determination of this award:

31 (c) Clive Fairbairn Perpetual Club Championship

- (i) Points are to be awarded to teams fielded in competitive grades by multiplying the corresponding number of points from the following table by the number of premierships points for each team as they appear on the premierships ladder at the end of the home and away games.
U16/1, U14/1 & U12/1 - 10 points
U16/2, U14/2 & U12/2 - 7 points
U16/3, U14/3 & U12/3 - 6 points
U16/4, U14/4 & U12/4 - 5 points
U16/5, U14/5 & U12/5 - 3 points
- (ii) The total number of points thus gained by all competitive teams fielded by the club for all the home and away games of the season shall then be divided by the number of competitive teams so fielded to calculate an average.
- (iii) The Total Championship Points will then be determined by the first multiplying the average calculated in (ii) above by 0.1 (10%), then multiplying by the number of teams fielded and finally using the result to the average calculated in (ii) above.

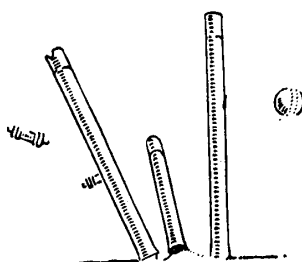

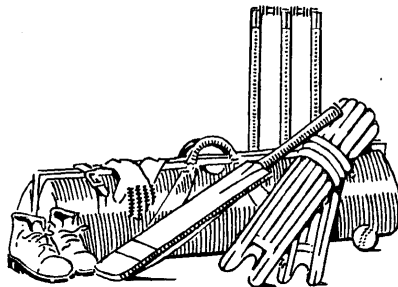
