The playing strength of an Association as a whole can only be measured on the field during inter Association matches and to this end the R.D.C.A. produced a most impressive record during the 1974-75 season with our Under 21 team winning our second C.U.O.V. premiership, in a magnificent team effort, and with all but one Australia Day team being triumphant.

As in previous seasons Ringwood Cricket Club assisted greatly with the provision of practice facilities for the Under 21 team, and Croydon Cricket Club, the new Senior Club in our District, again staged a Double Wicket Competition, the final of which was contested for the first time by two R.D.C.A. teams.

The provision of trophies by Hawthorn East Melbourne Cricket Club and Ringwood Cricket Club for Under Ago players whom it is considered have the most potential to progress to Senior cricket has provided young players with this opportunity and we thank these clubs for their support in this regard.

The maintainence of Grounds throughout our Association has been of a very high standard and for this we must thank the Councils concerned. However, the matter of ground rentals is better left unsaid at this juncture.

To my fellow executive members and all Club Secretaries and delegate I express my thanks for their assistance in my initial year as Association Secretary. Of the juniors, 197 also played Senior cricket during the season.

There were 125 clearance applications through last season, of which 117 players transferred to other clubs.

#### UMPIRES COMMITTEE REPORT

The 1974 - 75 season has been our most satisfying year yet for the following reasons: -

Teams co-operated more than in previous years.

Captains were helpful and generally their reports on Umpires were constructive and fair.

Only two players were reported.

Two "old" juniors umpired junior games for most of the season.

Of eight new umpires this year, seven were playing in the R.D.C.A. last year.

When players were requested to umpire finals games, 20 volunteers 5 from one club - Bedford.

On your behalf I sincerely thank those 20 volunteers for umpiring in all finals and doing such a fine job of it, your report on these people show how much their efforts were appreciated.

The action of appointing junior umpires will be continued next year and I ask your assistance to expand the panel. All interested are welcome at our meetings where they will be assisted in becoming good umpires. It may not be appreciated that being an umpire also improves cricket understanding and experience with this in mind we would be prepared to conduct a series of training nights for "would be" junior or senior umpires if the demand warranted it. Please take this idea back to your clubs and notify me of any interested persons.

As holders of the Joseph Cup competition for the year 1973-74 we played Dandenong in the final this year only to lose to a more even team. Congratulations to Dandenong, an association that, like us, recently rejoined a much rejuvinated Victorian Cricket Umpires Council.

We were unfortunate in losing the services of R. Wilson due to a traffic accident, D. Snowball through ill health and lastly Jack Hall (a long term umpire) also to ill health. My committee wish these fellow umpires a speedy recovery.

#### Senior Teens

Season 1974 - 75 was a very successful year for the Association with the highlight being the achievement of the Under 21 team in winning the Victorian Championship.
