PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Unlike the previous season, the weather god was extremely good to us with only one days play interrupted.

Unfortunately that day was our "grading" rounds and the inability to get results made the determinations on whether teams should be moved to other divisions somewhat clouded. This process is very subjective and at times clubs are not in the respective divisions were relatively even in standard.

Premiership are terrific to win, but in my view junior administrators have an obligation to enter teams in a division which challenges their players ability to prove the level of their game.

When I first joined the junior executive, four seasons ago, cricket was faced with a real challenge from basketball and the number of teams in the competition was diminishing.

It is therefore extremely pleasing to report that in season 97/98 there was an increase of 8 teams (to total of 148) and new registrations were up by more than 100 as compared to 96/97.

Essentially this increase is a spin off from the "Vic Hit/Milo have a go" program and those clubs who have embraced and worked very hard with this concept have and will continue to reap considerable benefits from their efforts. Clubs that have not yet become involved are urged to give it serious consideration.

A consequence of the increase in teams is a shortage of ground availability .Clubs should be on notice that the Junior Committee, perhaps as soon as next season, will have to schedule games on a Friday night and/or Sunday morning.

In keeping with the Rule that it is now compulsory for clubs to have a certain number of accredited coaches we arranged the conduct of courses prior to, and during, the season. The response was again positive and in excess of forty people obtained accreditation. Thanks to the generosity of the RDCA Veterans Association and the VCA there was no cost passed to the clubs and/or participants.

In last years annual report I wrote that a disturbing aspect of the season 96/97 was the number of instances that necessitated a penalty for breaches of the rules and/or procedures and the club administrators were asked to make a big effort to improve in this area. I would like to report that the result was positive but, in fact, it was quite the opposite and extremely disappointing.

Not only does it create disappointment for all concerned, it is very costly, in many cases money clubs can ill afford, and it creates a time consuming burden for certain members of the junior committee, all of which could essentially be eliminated with a more conscious effort from club administrators.

The committee have been keen to publicise the competition as much as possible and attempted to get a segment on the local radio station but it did not materialise. It was however, pleasing to see that the scores featured in the various newspaper publications far more frequently than was the case in 96/97.

Coloured clothing came more to the fore when Parkwood sought and received, committee approval for its U.12 competitive sides to play in coloured shirts. It was subsequently brought to our attention that the rule on colour of clothing need be clarified and club delegates will determine whether coloured shirts etc are permissible in the coming seasons.

It would appear that the format adopted for Presentation Night over the past two seasons meets with the approval of all concerned. We thank guests who assisted in the presentation of trophies and are most appreciative of the sponsorship by Paul Attfield from Topline Sports and also his efforts in arranging Brendan Ricci as guest speaker.

I again extend my congratulations to those teams and individuals who excelled during the season and attaining the highest honours.

Lastly, but certainly most importantly, I extend my thanks to committee members, representative managers and others who made a terrific contribution to the administration of the junior Association during the season. These people put in a lot of time, on a voluntary basis, and their efforts are a major reason for our Association being in a strong and healthy state as evidenced by the number of teams, the number of players we have selected in the major competitions and the results of our representative sides.

To those not aware, I am vacating the Junior Executive due to a role I have at club level.

My time on the committee has been enjoyable and rewarding, I've met a lot of people made new friends and hopefully been seen to contribute positively to our Association.

To those who may be contemplating taking a committee role I urge you to do so and I'm sure you will derive pleasure from such involvement.

Whilst no longer on the Junior Committee , I will continue to have some involvement with juniors at club level and looking forward to continuing contact with many of you in forthcoming seasons.

The evenness of the draw was highlighted where in one division three clubs entered the finals in the last game of the home and away series .

The final series was an outstanding success with the contribution from the volunteer umpires and official RDCA umpires who officiated in the under 16-1. The number of clubs who support the Junior Final series by their seniors volunteering to participate is left to few and this needs to be addressed in the coming season.

In closing I would like to thank the Committee for all the hard work and dedication throughout the season which made the task of secretary much easier . I am not seeking re-election as secretary but will continue in a different role next season . My thanks goes out to all the Junior Administrators for their support through my term as secretary .

Congratulation to all the premierships and the individual RDCA award winners.

REGISTRATION SECRETARY REPORT

A change of Junior Co-ordinator in a number of clubs, has a dramatic impact on this potful. Generally the registrations proceeded without problem, but there is the usual drama towards the end of the season, where because of incomplete registrations, points are either deducted or fines imposed in accordance with the rules. In my 2 years in the job, some clubs are certainly disadvantaged because of poor administration. The sooner Clubs appoint responsible people or consider Junior Committees to spread the workload, and importantly spend time to check the accuracy of match reports, the RDCA will continue to rake in the fines or worse still, deduct points that prevent juniors from participating in finals.

New registration continue to climb. A total of 590 new players became involved in cricket this year, an increase of round in 1996/97. A total of 152 teams were entered in the competitive and non -competitive age groups. It appears a number of RDCA clubs have embraced the VCA supported Milo Have -A-Go Program, which is a factor contributing to the new players entering the lower age groups. A breakdown of new registrations and clearances processed, for each Club, is detailed below. The transfer of information to the new computer system had its nightmares but information reliability is improved and will get better in time.

CLIVE FAIRBAIRN CLIVE CHAMPIONSHIP 1997-98

(1) To qualify for the trophy , a club must field at least one team in each of the Association’s competitive age divisions.

(2) The winner of this trophy will be determined on the points system as follows:-

(I) Points are to be awarded to teams fielded in the competitive grade **MULTIPLYING** the corresponding number of points from the following table by the number of premierships points for each team as they appear on the premierships ladder at the en of the home an away games.

UNDER 16/1,14/1,12/1	10 POINTS
UNDER 16/2,14/2,12/2	7 POINTS
UNDER 16/3,14/3,12/3	6 POINTS
UNDER 16/4,14/4,12/4	5 POINTS

(ii) The total number of points thus gained by all competitive teams fielded by the club for all the home and away games of the season shall then be *divided* by the number of competitive teams so fielded to calculate an *average*.

(iii) The total Championship Points Will then be determined by first *multiplying* the average calculated in (ii) above by 0.1 (10 %) then multiplying by the number of teams fielded and finally adding the result to the average calculated in (ii) above.
